



Frank Stowell is Professor of Systems and Information Systems, which he has held since 1990. He was formerly the Director of Campus at De Montfort University Milton Keynes then moved to back to Portsmouth in 2003 to undertake a leading role in Information Systems research. He has a PhD in Organisational Change and his research centres on participative design of Information Systems.

His present interest in soft systems and its relationship to phenomenology drives his current research activities. Frank has successfully supervised and examined a number of PhD research projects. He has published papers and texts in the 'Systems' field and presented papers at a number of international conferences in Europe and the United States.

He is involved in a number research projects notably the Systems Practice for Managing Complexity project, which was awarded a UK research agency grant for 3 years but continues as a self-sustaining network for managers from Industry and Academia.

He is past President of the UK Academy of Information Systems, past chair of the Council of Information Systems Professors (CISP) and the past and current President of the UK Systems Society. He has held several academic managerial roles including Head of the Department of Computing at two UK Universities. Prior to his academic career he was a consultant in a central government sponsored Management Systems Development Group and has experience of defining and developing IT supported management information systems.
