



Shann Turnbull graduated as an Electrical Engineer in Tasmania, became a flying instructor and obtained a BSc from the University of Melbourne. After a Harvard MBA he became a serial entrepreneur founding a number of ventures including two public mutual funds and three enterprises that became publicly traded. His experience as a corporate chairman and/or CEO increased as a founding member in 1967 of a private equity group that acquired control and re-organised eight listed corporations. In 1975 he authored [Democratising the Wealth of Nations](#) and became a founding author of the first [educational qualification](#) in the world for Company directors. He undertook the first economic analysis of [Aboriginal Communities](#) for the Australian Government in 1977/8. Shann was invited to advise on [stakeholder privatisation](#) in Czech+Slovakia (1990 & '91) and Beijing in 1991. His [PhD research](#) introduced bytes as a unit of analysis to establish [the science](#) of [governance](#) for any specie. Shann has published over [450 articles](#) on reforming the theories and practices of capitalism based on following the practices of nature. These include over 100 journal articles and book chapters. Two seminal articles were republished in [Corporate Governance: The history of *management thought*](#).
